Tradescants.

Looking at the Village Sign one sees around the border some foliage. This represents the plant Tradescantia.

It is there as an indication of a connection with the famous Tradescants, John and his son also John, who toured the world bringing back plants to England.

They both were appointed at various times the King's Gardener. John had a large estate at Lambeth, where he exhibited these exotic plants.

There is, however, only a tenuous connection with our village. The Tradescants were indeed an important family in Wenhaston, living at Wenhaston Grange. A number became churchwardens.

In 1553 Richard was at The Grange while his brother Thomas was at Lampitts and it was Thomas who had a son, Thomas in 1552. The family lived in our village for a few years and then later moved to Walberswick and he had a son - John.

So all we can really claim is that Wenhaston was the birthplace of John Tradescant's father.

News from the Bus Shelter

It's 'all change' on the buses!

From April 7th we are going to see a very different bus service in Wenhaston. The 521 will bypass Wenhaston, but the 601 service run by Anglian Coaches will run from Halesworth–Wenhaston–Southwold–Lowestoft and back – six days a week – hourly! A copy of the new timetable is enclosed.

The increased frequency of buses will be a great improvement for most people. Buses will still call at the station when trains are due and the new service will run a bit later in the day. Why not leave the car at home, save yourself money and help reduce Wenhaston's carbon footprint at the same time!

Most of us have a place in the garden where we want less weeding, less watering and good coverage. There's pretty much a plant or plants for every situation from dainty cyclamen - if you own up to a leylandii hedge, they'll grow under it! - through aromatic prostrate rosemary with all its pick-me-up qualities, to the hard working and 'man-proof' berberis. As always Matthew brought a huge selection of plants which were descended upon avidly at the end of the session.

Energy Support Group – Insulation Day in March

The word's getting around! And the offers are still open. A good crowd dropped into the Hall last month and got what they needed, we hope - latest information on insulation grants and low-cost deals.

Teresa Howarth and Dee Hibble of Suffolk Energy Action Link (SEAL) advised on benefits and grants available, and showed examples of internal insulation for non-cavity walls. Over half who came immediately booked a survey by Aran Insulation who are working with power companies on this scheme. They have a choice of two materials - Rockwool (made of Irish rock) and Warmcell (recycled paper). The latter has low embodied energy (energy involved in production) and is good for lofts and timber-frame walls, but not for solid walls where moisture could damage it. We have details of other materials available – all the way from sheepswool and hemp to fibreglass - but no special deals available at present.

If you're one of the 150 or so households (tenant or home-owning) who filled in Carbon Footprint questionnaires last summer and haven't yet applied for your money-and-energy-saving, reduced carbon emission opportunity, you can now call Ian Bowers of Aran on

01284 812520 for a no-obligation survey for either complete fit or a top-up of loft and/or cavity wall insulation. This would normally pay for itself in reduced energy bills in under five years. Conditions apply on grants. In bands A-C it's free for over 65's. Contact Teresa Howarth 01394 444206 for details.

Meter your own energy consumption

Janice Claxton is lending out Suffolk Coastal's "ElectriSave" kit (very simple!) for making an instant assessment of how much electricity you use – and therefore how you can SAVE – with lighting, appliances or heating. To borrow, call Janice on 01502 478158. You may be amazed!

They seek to identify practical and innovative solutions to a range of serious issues that face young people today. The projects vary but include work with :-

- Young runaways, or homeless young people, helping reduce the risks they face and improving their quality of life.
- Deprived and isolated communities, helping youngsters to have a better environment in which to grow up in, and including them in the decision making and responsibilities.
- Schools – finding the cause of disruptive behaviour and helping overcome the problems

while supporting teachers and parents and hopefully finding alternatives to exclusion.

- Children and Young people in the Public Care System, ensuring their rights are promoted and their voices heard.

If anyone reading this would like to have a box to collect coins (and notes!) for the Society, they are welcome to contact me (01502 478502) while Mollie is out of action.

Of the money collected

~ £5 would fund an Urban Survival Kit (shampoo, soap, flannel, toothbrush, underwear, socks, chocolate bar, coin for phone and gloves) for a young person on the streets.

~ £25 pays for a project worker to talk to a class of 30 children and to open the doors to the counselling available.

~ £70 will train 7 volunteers as mentors for young teenagers on remand, helping not only to keep them out of jail, but to face up to the consequences of their actions.

The Mothers' Union has supported the Children's Society for many years and we commend it to readers as a most worthy cause.

Wenhaston Commons What have we been up to?

A few people have expressed concerns to Wenhaston Parish Council over the regeneration works on Black Heath.

We would like to reassure you that the majority of work is now done and our vision is a mosaic of heather, new gorse, bramble, bracken, areas of grass and trees.

We are producing our 5 year plan which will be available to look at to all residents of Wenhaston, the Parish Council, Suffolk Coastal District Council (who has overall responsibility for the commons), Suffolk Wildlife Trust and Natural England before finalising it ready for the work parties recommencing in September.

Our Silver Studded Blue magazine will continue to be published twice a year delivered free to all residents with the 'Wenhaston Word' giving information on commons management and local flora and fauna. Our work will be incorporated in the Parish Plan.

On Black Heath we have had heaps removed (re-instating one track at the same time), noted the location of some paths which residents would like reopened, supported the re-instatement of one track and agreed a way forward for the area on the south side of the heath.

At the Annual Parish Meeting on Wednesday April 23rd, Wenhaston Commons Group will give a report and answer any questions and the Parish Council will address the issue of tracks, the Horse Route on Black Heath and commons bye-laws.

We are planning an event later in the year to celebrate our commons.

Good response to village cricket field plan

A large number of people from the village attended the meeting (March 6) to discuss the offer by Jack Ellis and Heather Phillips to donate a field for a village cricket ground. They heard more details of the proposed location of the ground and the potential costs if the project goes ahead.

Two clubs – Wenhaston Wanderers and Halesworth Pumas (whose membership includes a large number of Wenhaston players) – declared a strong interest in playing at the new ground and working together on the project. Roger Desborough, who currently farms the field, voiced concern about the maintenance of the existing sports facilities and the ability of the cricket clubs to take on further work. As a result it was agreed that the two teams should get together with the Sports Club and put up an action plan to the Parish Council before calling another meeting.

If the plan gets the go ahead, it is hoped that fund raising will begin in the summer and work on the field and square will start next spring with the prospect of the first game of cricket being played in the summer of 2010.

Preventative Planting to Deter Unwelcome Visitors

Have you ever thought that while improving your garden you could be making your property a little safer with plants that are unfriendly to intruders and burglars?

There are various hedging plants and shrubs that have defensive systems and will form dense and thorny barriers which will help to protect your property if grown along boundaries, near windows or against walls and fences. Hedges are particularly useful in protecting the boundary of your garden.

Burglars particularly dislike prickly plants and an accidental brush with a thorn may leave DNA and fragments at the scene of the crime.

Native species that are most suitable and help biodiversity include: Beech, Blackthorn, Box Escallonia, Field maple Hawthorn, Hazel, Holly, Hornbeam Privet, Pyracantha, Yew.

Mixed hedges containing some of these species can be designed to suit the location and create a strong boundary, creating shelter and security.

Thorny shrubs that can be used to form dense borders include:

- ✓ Barberry / Berberis species of various heights
- ✓ Firethorn / Pyracantha species with coloured berries
- ✓ Shrub rose / Rosa rugosa species with pink or white flowers and hips/fruit.
- ✓ Gorse / Genista hispanica
- ✓ Ornamental bramble / Rubus species

Shrubs which form dense thickets and growth include:

- ✓ Cotoneaster conspicuus 'Decorus' and other taller species
- ✓ Elaeagnus x ebbingei and E angustifolia
- ✓ Flowering currant /Ribes species
- ✓ Symphoricarpos chenaultii 'Hancock'
- ✓ Lonicera pileata
- ✓ Prunus laurocerasus

For advice on planting and fencing contact your District Planning Authority and / or Landscape Officer. For advice on hedging the Parish Council or Tree Warden may be able to help you.
