News from the Bus Shelter

Wenhaston Birds - A Tale of Two Winters (with apologies to Chas 'n' Bill)

A second successive cold and protracted winter has, after a long run of relatively mild winters, taken us somewhat by surprise. As a keen skier, the wonderful Alpine like powder snow that graced our landscape this year induced me to wax the skis and take to the slopes near Blowers Common!

Just as the snow brings us mixed emotions, from a bird watching point of view it brings as many opportunities as it does concerns for our feathered friends. This is only my second winter in the village but it couldn't have contrasted more from the first in terms of ornithological jottings.

For the winter of 2009/10 my notebook was full of interesting records as follows. Almost daily I watched up to 5 handsome Stonechats feeding along fence posts close to Laurel Farm. During the first deep snow, for a period of 3 weeks, I could almost guarantee to see

a Kingfisher diving headlong into what seemed to be boggy marsh. On closer inspection, when the bird vacated its perch, I discovered that it had found a fast running stream not more than 4 inches deep and about a foot wide in among the otherwise frozen waste – astonishing adaptability! Another regular visitor to the marshes was a magnificent female Peregrine, which terrorised the assembled waders. It seems as though it was there for sport as much as food as on one occasion the bird 'stooped' spectacularly onto an unsuspecting Redshank, killing it in one fell swoop but dumping its prey unceremoniously into the white stuff below. By contrast, the same notebook is almost untouched this winter. No Stonechats, Kingfishers, Peregrines, Hen Harrier, Water Rail, Pintail, flocks of Yellowhammers and a lot more beside.

My theory is that this winter was so cold (temperatures rarely rising above freezing from late November to early February) that many birds had moved further south to warmer climes. One barometer was the relative absence of Fieldfares and Redwing, which last winter were abundant with flocks of up to 300 birds. This winter I haven't once recorded a three figure count, the biggest flock being about 80 birds on stubble close to Low Farm in early February. Another indicator has been the abundance of local Waxwings, I have not seen

this bird in Wenhaston, but there have been regular sightings of this hugely attractive winter visitor in nearby villages and towns. They are always more abundant in the UK in severe winters as they flee from extremes of cold in Scandinavia.

Not to be too downhearted, this year's notes featured a pair of Jack Snipe, the smaller, more confiding cousin of the Common Snipe. It's a bird that any watcher worth his salt loves to get on their year list. These two birds were to be found regularly performing their characteristic 'bobbing' in snow covered fields and ditches that lie between Marsh Cottage and the river. Every cloud etc. etc!!

I am now looking forward to Spring and beyond with enthusiasm. Last Autumn was especially rewarding with a huge range of waders and other rarities locally. In my next piece, I will tell of some success stories including the apparent expansion of Bearded Tits in our local reedbeds. Happy Birdwatching to all.

Wenhaston WI

What an adventure, to travel to Lapland there to live rough for several months. Mike Upson gave us an amusing and informative talk of his experiences on this epic journey. With two companions he left Newcastle and sailed to Gothenburg, then drove through Sweden and Finland, a drive that took them two days. Imagine their dismay when finally arriving at the Arctic Circle to find tacky shops and enormous signs with Father Christmas plastered all over them. They quickly drove on into the wilderness, seeing many different birds and flowers on their way.

Their diet was pretty basic, breakfast; cereal and milk, Lunch; Cheese and bread, Dinner; Tinned meat and vegetables with smash potatoes. They pitched their tent on the Tundra which was surprisingly soft. This was a weird landscape where the trees grow horizontally on the peat which in turn lies on rock.

In these remote places they came upon derelict war defences, nature gradually taking over, birds nesting in the crevices in the concrete and plants covering the structures. One highlight was watching a White Tailed Eagle which had nested in the quarry where the men had camped. Another was watching a Long Tailed Scua chick emerging from its shell.

On the way home they stopped at Santa Claus village to buy souvenirs. Wallis was so disgusted with the tat that he stayed in the car. Seeing a sledge tied to the roof of their car an unwary tourist asked him where his reindeer was. 'I ate it,' came the terse reply.

So many things in the pipe line: Badger watching, A boat trip, A concert at Leiston Abbey, A theatre trip to London, the list goes on and on.

Wenhaston Millions

A local sensation occurred in 1934 when the 'Wenhaston Millions' came to light. It appears that a Major Crane persuaded a man from Blythburgh and two brothers from Wenhaston to part with £5,000 and their reward would be millions. His case was that he had a mortgage with a London bank and they had refused payment on one of his cheques and he was suing them. He claimed that the Bank of England had taken his side in the claim to a very large sum of money. Major Crane was very glib and our locals were completely taken in by his promises of riches. He claimed to have the matter in the hands of the High Court and the Official Secrets Act was quoted.

As time went by the claim, with interest, had increased to 45 million pounds! He produced a document said to be signed by King George V, no less, supporting the claim. However he overstepped the mark when he arranged to marry a Mrs Duke, who was already married but our Major insisted he could arrange a quick divorce. The local vicar was not convinced by the forged signatures on the document and when he made investigations Major Crane went missing!

On July 19th he was arrested at Hackney selling vegetables and was found guilty of fraud and sentenced to four years. It all made front page news in the National Papers. Afterwards it transpired that even his name was false. Not Major Crane but David Percy Caprice, married with three children and he even held a forged passport showing him having a balance of millions of pounds.

Bogus Burglar Alarm Sales

Following a number of complaints, Suffolk Trading Standards are warning residents to be vigilant when opening their doors to companies offering burglar alarms for as little as a pound.

A salesperson may cold call by telephone and insist on visiting the same day to discuss the installation of a free or cheap alarm. Companies may also use high-pressure tactics to scaremonger residents.

Based on previous complaints, Trading Standards found that the companies failed to mention hidden fees for the monitoring, upkeep and rapid response facilities. Some residents have found themselves tied into a long contract agreement costing thousands of pounds.

James Garrett, Suffolk Fair Trading Officer said; "We are urging residents, especially

elderly or vulnerable people, to be aware of such calls. Our advice is not to buy anything based on a cold call. If you intend to make a major purchase always research the market and get at least three quotes from reputable companies."

If residents do not wish to receive unsolicited sales and marketing telephone calls, they can register for free via the Telephone Preference Service on 0845 070 0707 or www.tpsonline.org.uk.
