Local History Matters: 29

Albert George Spink

I freely admit that none of the following is due to any research by me. It was at the instigation of Alan D Clark, who pointed out that the above gentleman was born in Wenhaston in 1869 and became a famous Music Hall Artiste. Research undertaken by Eileen Heaps has enabled me to write this short life story.

It would appear that Albert George Spink was born in Wenhaston in 1869, a son of George and Hannah Spink. He toured the Music Halls as Peter Dandy George and Rosie, Rosie being a dog! He married Mary Beatrice Gregory in 1896, but she died in 1906 and he married again - Ena Bertoldi, who was an Acrobat and Stage Entertainer and she died in London.

Dandy George and his dog Rosie starred in a short black and white film in 1927 entitled 'Dandy George and Rosie'. It was made by De Forest Phonofilm. He died in 1947, but there does not appear to be any mention of him any further in the Wenhaston Archives so that it is possible that although born in Wenhaston, he did not live here for any stretch of time. *Keith Johnceline*

Do you remember Rosie Harrison?

You may find something of her spirit and her love of Suffolk life in the pages of *Artichoke Hearts* written by Rosie's daughter in law Sita Brahmachari. Rosie was, in the words of her dear friend and poet Cicely Herbert, 'A truly exceptional human being.'


She bought her charming weather-boarded, tinned roof bungalow in Thorington in the scorching summer of 1976. As the late Dusty Flint her friend and neighbour commented with true Suffolk warmth 'You've brought that sunshine with you, Rosie!'

She was one of a group of artists, musicians and writers from Hampstead who were inspired by the big sky of Suffolk and the welcoming spirit of local people. She had exhibitions of her own and her son Alex's work in the Halesworth Art Gallery.

Somewhere in the houses along these lanes there are magical paintings telling stories of Suffolk character: a stick insect being blessed at Blythburgh church, 'The Pumpkin Garden,' laid out on the Flint's front yard at Halloween, a portrait of the late Dan Del Rivo in her garden enjoying a glass of wine, the plump pink-fleshed leg of a girl walking alongside one of Mr Peck's pigs, 'Brenda's Leaning Shed' singing with wallflowers... a single yellow flower against a blue sky growing from the Dunwich shingle...

Turn Up The Heat On Oil Thieves

Suffolk Police are issuing advice to help keep heating oil safe and secure following a number of thefts of oil totalling thousands of litres.

Just a few simple steps can help make your oil tank and fuel more difficult for thieves to target.

- Screen your tank with fencing or hedges
- Close and secure any gates leading to the tank
- Conceal or cover any external pipes and fuel lines
- Install lockable caps supported by a closed shackle padlock
- Regularly check your fuel levels. Sensors which monitor levels from inside the home are available
- Consider installing a tank alarm
- Join a Neighbourhood Watch Scheme

It should be noted that some oil storage containers are plastic and some are metal so any security measures which directly affect the tank or pipe work should always be installed in consultation with the tank supplier.

Crime Reduction Officer Bernard Plume said, 'We're all relying on our central heating systems and for those who live in more rural areas it's often oil-fired.

If you're leaving access open for a delivery, make sure the cap is locked after the fuel arrives.

Large quantities of oil are often stolen, which means the thieves will need sizeable containers to collect the oil in and a van or a larger vehicle with which to take it away. If you see any suspicious persons or vehicles in your road or a neighbour's driveway, contact police immediately by dialling 999.

We need people to be vigilant. Keep an eye on your neighbours' properties.'

Suffolk SAFEKey service

What would happen if an incident occurred at your property, and you couldn't be contacted? Suffolk SAFEKey, Suffolk Constabulary's keyholder service, gives you the opportunity to register nominated keyholders for your property.

A keyholder is someone you trust such as a friend who lives near your property and who has access to your premises in your absence. Having a nominated keyholder helps ensure that should an incident happen at your property the Police are able to contact a person nominated by yourself, helping to ensure greater peace of mind that an incident can be dealt with as swiftly as possible by Suffolk Constabulary.

Benefits of registering with Suffolk SAFEKey are:

- Storage to a maximum of 4 keyholders for business premises and 2 for a residential property
- Contact details for property owner's GP
- Storage of information relating to hazardous materials or other potential dangers
- Details of a preferred plumber, window boarder/glazier
- Secure and encrypted online management of your registration via a dedicated website 24 hours a day
- Noise pollution from a false alarm may more readily be reduced through speedier notification to Local Authority, Environmental Health Officers
- Dedicated customer support team open during office hours

As Suffolk SAFEKey is an additional service offered by Suffolk Constabulary, there is an annual fee. Residential Registrations costs £12 (incl. vat) per year, non-residential Registrations cost £35 (+ vat) per branch registered per year. Payment can be made online or over the phone or by using a valid credit / debit card. Payment by cheque is available for postal registrations only.
