A144 Strengthening of Spexhall Rail Bridge


As part of the recent introduction of 40 Tonne lorries all bridges were structurally assessed to check their capacity for the increased loads. Spexhall Bridge, which carries the Halesworth/Bungay A144 road over the East Suffolk Rail Line needs appropriate strengthening. The Bridge is owned by Network Rail (NR), but Suffolk County Council (SCC) is responsible for ensuring that it can safely carry 40 Tonne traffic so this work is a joint project between NR and SCC. The work will be carried out by NR's contractor Kier Rail and will involve disruption to both rail and road users.

The rail line will be closed for two weekends, 27 February/1 March and 7/8 March, with an alternative bus service.

The A144 will be closed from 27 February to 8 March 2009. The signed diversion route will be via Beccles and Bungay. Local temporary weight restrictions will be in place to restrict lorries to suitable roads. Temporary traffic lights will be in operation across the bridge before and after the closure, from 19 January to 27 March.

Although changes to the above dates are not expected, any necessary changes will be displayed on notices. Both NR and SCC understand the disruption that this work will cause, but we can assure you that the work has been planned to be completed in the shortest possible time.

Trees on our Commons

For some years now the view looking north from the seat on Bickers Heath over the Blyth Valley towards Blyford church and the Queens Head pub has been disappearing due to the trees along Low Road.

The other side of the village on Black Heath we have a similar situation - trees on the southern edge of the heath are blocking out light which is preventing the regeneration of the south-facing slope facing over the marshes towards Church Farm

We can restore the views from these lovely rare elevated spots with sensitive thinning of the trees.

We have consulted with Suffolk Coastal District Council, the manager of our Commons, and there is money available for selective thinning in both of these areas to allow more light and improve the views.

News from the Bus Shelter

There are times when going to Lowestoft just won't do and you can't resist that trip to Norwich. I don't enjoy the journey by car and parking is difficult particularly at busy times and it's always expensive. The 'Park and Ride' at Harford seems to offer a good alternative but the bus journey from there into the city is still a long one.

The Anglian Bus 588 service to Norwich runs regularly from Saxons Way via Bungay but it doesn't connect particularly well with the 601 from Wenhaston unless you have a little job or two to do in Halesworth first. So why not do your own 'Park and Ride'? Parking in town costs up to £1.50 for the day and the bus fare is £5 return for those who pay so it's still cheaper than taking the car all the way. There are great views from the double-decker buses which terminate in St Stephens Street - a handy place to start shopping.

Are you interested in setting up a village food buying group?

The idea is to form a group of village people to run a sort of Village Co-Op to buy food in bulk for our members at cost. This could result in substantial savings as wholesale prices are about half retail prices on some kinds of food.

The idea is that once a month we put together a village order for dry foods such as rice, flour, pasta, cereals, beans, nuts, sugar etc and order these in bulk from a wholesaler. When these are delivered we divide them up and each member collects their order.

News from the Village Hall

We hope you all enjoyed the Christmas Bazaar. There certainly was plenty to buy, eat, drink, or have a go at. Even Santa visited and entertained the children! Many thanks to all who made this annual village event so successful.

A lot has been happening behind the scenes with the Village Hall project. Our success with WESG in the EEDA Cut your Carbon Competition actually gave us the right to formally apply for the £70,000 that we entered in for in the first place! Jon Bell (EnergyMix Director) has been working incredibly hard with the VHMC to complete and submit the final application forms. In addition, planning applications have been submitted for the biomass boiler/fuel storage building and photovoltaic cell system.

We understand that insulation works could start by February with the other larger works starting shortly afterwards. If all goes to plan the energy efficiency aspects could be complete by March/April. Great care will be taken to minimise disruption to Village Hall life during this time. User groups will be advised of planned works and implications.

The loft space currently being used for storage needs clearing and boards lifted. Further details will be distributed to clubs and a 'clearance weekend' is being planned for the New Year.

The expanded Buildings Sub-Committee has also been developing thoughtful ideas and plans for the kitchen, bar area and toilets. Some really innovative work is going into these aspects and user groups will be consulted when the proposals are completed.

The Village Hall project is now entering an exciting period where we will start to see things happening, so please feel free to come and have a look.
