Finally, the refurbishment plans for the kitchen, bar and toilets are still at the developmental stage but be assured they will be made available for consultation by user groups before any further action

Petanque - The League Wants You

Regardless of age or ability, the Suffolk Coastal Petanque League are looking for any interested person in the Wenhaston area to get in touch regarding the possibility of playing petanque in the 2009 season. It doesn't matter whether you have played before or not, as advice and coaching can be given.

What the League are looking for is any interested individual, couple, family group, sports and social clubs and pubs that can form into teams of just 4 players and who perhaps have the space to play two games simultaneously. One of the financial benefits of the sport is that if you have or know of a decent gravelled area, then you have a ready-made playing area. Gravelled car parks to pubs, village halls and community centres are usually the most widely used areas for new teams and are relatively easy to cordon off for a match to be played.

The Coastal League had its first season in 2008 with nine teams being split into a North and a South section (to limit travelling between matches) with matches starting in April and being played approximately every third week until September when the Leagues' play-offs were held to ascertain the overall winners. As already stated teams need to be a minimum of 4 players up to a maximum of 8. Matches are usually played on a Sunday morning, with the host venue usually providing after-match refreshments.

The cost to join is £12 per team for the entire 2009 season and Registration Night is to be held on Friday 27th March from 7:30pm onwards at Ye Olde Coach & Horses, Melton, near Woodbridge. If at ninety I am as active and full of fun as our WI I shall be well pleased!

Guests and members past and present all gathered together in Wenhaston Village Hall to celebrate the auspicious occasion of our ninetieth birthday. Of course we sang Jerusalem. A new and beautifully embroidered tablecloth graced our President's table.

Helen had studied our past records and read some out. During the war the government sent tonnes of sugar to Suffolk with instructions for WIs to make jam and rose-hip syrup for the war effort. Wenhaston made 1,000 jars of jam which was impressive but Blyford exceeded this by making 2,000 jars.

Chris then gave us an insight into the earlier accounts. The annual subscription was two shillings; in 1918 we paid a boy 1/3d to move the chairs!

Rosemary then read us a charming poem she had composed.

After photos were taken of some of our past Presidents our speaker began his talk on Jerusalem. He gave us a potted biography of William Blake, who didn't attend school but was taught by his mother. At the age of 14 his skill as an artist was apparent and he became an apprentice to an engraver, where he produced unusual paintings and poems.

Blake had a vision of Milton, who admitted that in 'Paradise Lost' he had made the Devil more interesting than God, so he suggested that Blake should redress the balance, so Blake wrote the words to the poem we know and love. Hubert Parry put the words to music. Later Edward Elgar was asked to write a more rousing tune.

Joan thanked Mark for an excellent informative and amusing talk.

The evening closed with a glass of bubbly and delicious canapés.

Irish Festival Fraud

Officers from Staffordshire Police are investigating a fraud enquiry which could have affected people across the country.

Between Friday 18 July and Monday 21 July 2008 an Irish festival was due to be held at Pontins in Pakefield, Suffolk.

Tickets for the event were booked through Staffordshire travel company Pilgrims Abroad but the weekend was cancelled at the last minute.

It could be that residents in Suffolk, Norfolk and Leeds may have been affected by the event's cancellation.

DC 4958 Lisa Dale of Staffordshire Police said, 'We are currently investigating whether the company taking the bookings for this event have acted fraudulently.

I appeal for anyone who booked this weekend and has never received a full refund to contact me.

Similarly, I would ask any of the acts that were booked to play at the weekend who have never been paid to also get in touch'.

Trading Standards have contacted Suffolk Constabulary regarding Charity collections where a leaflet is left asking for clothing and bric-a-brac to be left out for collection. They have offered the following advice:

Usually such companies operate by collecting clothing and selling the items on for profit and then donating a fixed sum (usually very low !) to the named charity. Our advice to Suffolk consumers is not to leave clothes out for these organisations.

A company that recently leafleted the Hadleigh area is of particular concern as its charity status was actually withdrawn in October 2008. We would advise all residents to read any leaflets carefully before deciding to donate goods.

Sport

Athletics. Mark Procter, a shot putter, represented his country in the European Cup 1998, Commonwealth Games 2002 and 2006, and the Olympic Games 2000. He lived in Narrow Way, Wenhaston.

Bowls. Club formed in 1932 and started playing on Rectory land in 1934. In 1996 moved to new location by the village Playing Field.

Football. First mention of a very old type of football in 1644 when Thomas Ambler, the priest, was accused of allowing the young men of the village to play the game on church land on Sunday afternoons.

The football club 'Wenhaston Rovers' was first formed in 1898. Now Wenhaston United they have achieved success in winning Division 2 in Ipswich and Suffolk League in 1990/91 and winning the Suffolk Junior Cup in 1995. Since 1995 the Club has had mixed fortunes being relegated and promoted in equal measure. In January 2009 they were second in Division One, and in the previous season reached the semi final of the Suffolk Junior Cup.

Sports Club. Opened in September 2003 and comprises a hard all weather tennis court and another with markings for tennis, netball and basketball.

Other sports. Carpet Bowls, Badminton and Table Tennis in Village Hall.
There was a Rifle Club 1912 - 1916.

Wenhaston with Mells Hamlet Parish Council

The Parish Council's response to SCDC Local Development Framework has been put up on the notice boards. Also on One Suffolk Web Site - see Parish Council and go to Wenhaston Parish Council.

SCDC and SCC Archaeological department have agreed that the Archaeological survey required for the change of use from agricultural to cricket field need not take place.

The draw for the allotments has taken place and the water pipe has been installed.

Star Hill Footpath. The District Council has agreed to accept the liability for the footpath if the Parish Council pays for the maintenance of the footpath. This would be about £7,000.00 over 20 years, £350.00 per annum. The Council voted in favour to pay this in order to get the footpath after many years of waiting.

The Parish Council has been requested by the family of the Late Maurice Stammers that they plant a tree in his memory in Blyford Lane. This was unanimously agreed by the Councillors.

Concerns were raised that SCC Waste Core Strategy Issues and Options Consultation paper includes Thorington Pit as a possible site for a landfill for non-hazardous waste. As soon as more information becomes available then a public meeting will be arranged if the Council thinks it is appropriate.

The Parish Council has received from EDDA on behalf of the Village Hall the sum of £48,484.00 for the Energy programme. £26,565.95 has been paid to Dulas and £19,222.35 to Econergy Ltd for the boiler and PV installations.

The Computer Club has been put on hold until the spring when the work on the Village Hall has been completed. *Mary Pennock, Clerk*

Spring - and a Gardener's thoughts turn to, well, actually getting stuck in. And we have no excuse now after our visit from Bob Coutts who gave us a clear, no-nonsense lesson in the intricacies of growing from seeds, cuttings and some valuable tips on pruning. In these money conscious times we shall be making every expensive seed count, we shall save on pots by using the right size - carefully scrubbed, of course, but we will splash out on a good seed compost. Those straggly, overwintering geraniums, fuchsias, et al, will be trimmed and turned into a phalanx of new plants. But we will not be trigger-happy with our secateurs in the garden until we have decided what needs pruning and when. A little thought and research saves a lot of wasted effort.

Looking further ahead, we are already taking names for our two Summer Outings which are: 18th June Corpusty Mill and Priory Maze, in Norfolk Cost £20

9th July Cambridge Botanic Gardens, includes tour and opportunity to go into the City if desired. Cost £20. Two excellent days out so do sign up.




