



Play your part to keep fireworks fun

As the dark nights draw in, we can look forward to seasonal events such as Bonfire Night. Traditionally this is the time to enjoy fireworks but increasingly they are used all year round to celebrate many occasions.

While most people enjoy fireworks responsibly, in the wrong hands they can cause real misery through anti-social behaviour. Many adults and children suffer fireworks injuries either through accidents or intentional attacks.

Letting off noisy fireworks late at night with no regard for neighbours can cause distress by frightening people and pets, while a dangerous minority deliberately use fireworks to intimidate residents and damage property.

The laws against firework misuse have been strengthened to protect communities and provide more powers to tackle the problem locally. Misuse offences relate to throwing, possession and controlling when fireworks are used, and other laws regulate the supply and sales of fireworks.

Did you know?

- It is an offence to set off fireworks in public places such as parks, streets and school grounds. They should not be sold to young people.
- You cannot set off fireworks between 11:00pm and 7:00am, except on 5 November, Diwali, New Year's Eve and Chinese New Year, when the curfew is extended to 1:00am.
- Offences carry fines of up to £5000, or six months imprisonment. A range of anti-social behaviour orders may be used to prevent fireworks misuse by persistent offenders.

Important News! Date to Remember this month! Friday 9th November at the Village Hall - 7 for 7:30pm

Carbon Footprint Questionnaire Analysis presented by CRed & Public Forum led by Professor Tim O'Riordan, Dept of Environmental Science, University of East Anglia. For everyone, whether or not you filled in a questionnaire. Please come and be part of this important next stage in the village's response to climate change. We will have time to ask questions, and discuss amongst ourselves – and by the end of the evening we should have identified two or three specific areas to work on.

Michael Dickson and I went last month to the County Council's "Creating the Greenest County" Conference in Ipswich where four hundred people came to discuss the part each are playing. Wenhaston is now part of the Suffolk Strategic Partnership's project which supports communities in being more energy-efficient and reducing reliance on fossil fuels. Our display with CRed was alongside Sproughton village which held its own Energy Day last weekend - inspired by what they'd heard about our carbon reduction work!

We went to seminars including "Creating the Greenest Communities" (of course) and came back with a pocketful of ideas and names of people who are there to guide us – especially Wil Gibson, Chief Executive of Suffolk ACRE, the charity which promotes economic, environmental and social well-being of communities across the county. To hear that chairman John Gummer MP and keynote speaker Michael Meacher MP both were agreeing on climate change action was encouraging. Mr Gummer warned us that we'd soon be getting a letter asking what specific action we'll take at home, in work, and towards encouraging our Parish (or other) Councils to act – "because Parish Councils are vital", he said. And there'd be a follow-up letter asking what we've put into positive action! So - we'll be writing to him.

The other important date is Friday 7th December "An Inconvenient Truth"- The climate change film, further validated by Al Gore's recent nomination for Nobel Peace Prize - will be shown in Wenhaston at the Church Room at 7:30pm, with (further!) opportunity for discussion afterwards. As you know space is limited so come early to put down your cushion.

Local History Matters: 6

Interesting Inhabitants.

The first constable named in the records for Wenhaston was Abraham Nolloth in 1680.

I was amused to note that he was fined two shillings in 1708 for cutting down a tree that belonged to church lands!

Harry Becker lived in the village for some years. He was a well known painter who painted local people at work. He was around in the 1920s.

Virtue Vice. A contradiction of names I reckon! She was a woman from Wenhaston, baptised on 11th January 1735/6, daughter of Laurence and Elizabeth. She spent many years in The House of Industry at Bulcamp.

On 26th September 1768 she petitioned for clothing for two of her four children.

On 18th September 1769 she was allowed two pairs of stockings, a pair of shoes, and a waistcoat for her son Thomas. Again on 12th February 1770 allowed five shillings having been ill for six months.

On 14th May 1781 allowed 18 pence.

She was given a paupers funeral on 28th September 1787. *Keith Johnceline*

Can You Help?

My father's family came from the village of Wenhaston back in 1800.

Charles Vice was born to William and Hannah Vice née Frances, in 1800. He was a bricklayer, and went to London and married Emma Frances in August 1822 at St Marylebone, in the name of Charles Howard.

His grandmother was Virtue Vice. Born in 1735, she had 4 illegitimate children between 1758-1765. The name has changed over the years, sometimes Voice or Vyse and sometimes her children and grandchildren used the surname Howard.

I have not found a Howard family in Wenhaston before 1800.

The local Workhouse opens at Bulcamp in the 1760s but no list of inmates has survived before 1841. So I am trying to locate the Big House of that time in the village where Virtue may have worked as a servant girl, as most of the illegitimate children were born to servant girls at that time, and to have 4 seems very usual.

Are there any big houses left and can anyone help me with information about the village in 1750-70 please? Many thanks.
