#### Two Firsts for Wenhaston (and Suffolk)

The Devil's Fingers (Clathrus archeri)
This strange fungus appeared on wood chippings (from New Zealand) in a garden in Blackheath in September 2007. It was first described from Tasmania in 1860 where it is not uncommon. Rare in England, it is usually associated with wood chippings, now used as a mulch. Related to our common Stinkhorn it develops from an egg under the surface of the mulch.

Four to eight pink spongy arms develop from a central stem with the olive coloured spore mass spread over the upper surface of the arms.

Silver Studded Blue Butterfly (Plebeius araus)

Butterfly Conservation tell us that this species usually disappears by the end of August. However our local recorder spotted three

females and one male on Blackheath on 6th September. This is the latest record for Suffolk at present and an encouraging

result for the local BAP group in what has been a difficult year for butterfly recording in general.

The unpleasant smell attracts flies which quickly disperse the spores.

#### **Walter Wilson**

A large number of friends joined the family in Wenhaston Village Hall on 7th September for a Celebration of the life of Walter James Wilson who died peacefully in the Patrick Stead Hospital on 26 August. He was 77 and apart from two years National Service in the RAOC had lived in Wenhaston and worked in the area all his life.

Memorials to his skills as a bricklayer include Hooker House in Halesworth that he reconstructed when this was necessary to make way for the Halesworth relief road and the magnificent stone chimney on his bungalow in St Michael's Way.

He married Jean Irvine who was a trainee nurse at Patrick Stead Hospital in 1955 and they had two sons. After retirement it had become necessary for him to devote his time to Jean who had become totally incapacitated with arthritis. The limited spare time he had was spent on wood turning and evidence of his talents was on display in the form of objets d'art in the hall.

The celebration was conducted by Humanist Celebrant Michael Imison of Halesworth who said that Walter was a man who had set himself the highest standards and who unquestioningly performed what he saw as his duty to others particularly his wife Jean, he found no need to follow the dictates of any religion. Burial took place in Wenhaston cemetery and the coffin was escorted by the Wenhaston Branch of the Royal British Legion led by the standard bearer John Levy. Chairman Nelson Wright recited the Legion exhortation at the graveside.

The Environment Agency are holding public meetings at Walberswick Village Hall on Friday 28th September from 2:00pm to 7:00pm and at Reydon Village Hall on Saturday 29th September 10:00am to 4:00pm, to explain the draft strategy relating to the Blyth Estuary.

Hastoe Housing will be having an open day at the Village Hall sometime in the next few months to show the proposed plans of the development in Narrow Way. I will put a notice on the Parish Notice Board as soon as I get confirmation of the date.

The District Council are currently reviewing its options in relation to the use of the land behind Narrow Way for Allotments. Planning matters. Change of Use from retail to residential at Post Office Cottage, The Street, Wenhaston. Was approved by the Council. Planning decision by SCDC approving the removal of branches of Beech Tree at Oakhurst. Blackheath Road, Wenhaston.
