Wenhaston W.I. March Report

Our meeting began in a sombre mood as we commemorated with a minutes silence the life of one of our members, Eileen Snelling who had been frail for some time Heather read a short address on Eileen's active and interesting life.

The mood was hardly lightened by our speaker's subject. The work of the NSPCC. It was the first time John Simpson had spoken to a WI group, I am sure it won't be the last as he was an excellent speaker. He began his talk by giving us the background of the NSPCC which was set up in 1884 and now incorporates Child Line. Then he related some chilling statistics. One child a week dies at the hands of a parent or a carer. They receive 200,000 calls a year from adults concerned about children. Child Line receives 4,000 calls a day from young children in trouble. 700 children a week are put on the child protection list.

Britain has more child abuse than any other country in Europe. What's gone wrong? Break down of the family unit; break down of marriage, families spread out. Then there is alcohol abuse, drug abuse, violence between parents, serious bullying and the modern evil of Internet child pornography. To help combat the latter mobile 'phone companies and credit card suppliers give information to the police. Microsoft also helps track down these despicable web sites.

What can we do? Understand and recognise child abuse. Listen to peoples' problems and give support. If one is concerned in any way contact the N.S.P.C.C.

After this talk our business seemed rather trivial. Eileen and Felicity both gave a report on days one and two of their course on "Speaking with Confidence", and final details on various outings were given.

The Club welcomes the new village newsletter and takes this opportunity to invite all residents of Wenhaston and neighbouring communities to join the Club. The Sports area on the village Playing Field comprises a skateboarding area, which is open to all at any time, a tennis court for members' use and a multisport court for five-a-side football, basketball, etc. These courts are floodlit, so are available during the evenings until 9.30 pm as well as during daylight hours.

Cycling is also part of the Club's activities. The Wenhaston Wheelers go for 10-mile or 25-mile rides at weekends and, for the first time this year, will be starting occasional rides further afield than the regular routes that start and finish in the village. Our first ride will be on Sunday 15 April starting and finishing at The

Star and in May, we will be taking our bikes to Woodbridge and cycling home from there, taking quiet country lane routes.

This year, the Club will be organising the Village Open Gardens event, together with an Arts & Crafts Show. Look out for more details of these during the weekend of 16-17 June.

The evening before this piece was written in mid-March, there were more than 25 youngsters using these facilities, playing football, tennis, skateboarding, BMX riding and having a great time. New Beginning for Wenhaston Pre-School

Tuesday 17th April is set to be an auspicious day for the community of Wenhaston when its pre-school will open in a new purpose-built extension to the primary school at 10.00 am sharp.

The honour of cutting the ribbon goes to Mrs Violet Jackson of St Michaels Way who is the much revered former teacher of several generations of Wenhastonians and still regularly

visits the primary school to help children with their reading.

COMMUNITY EFFORT

Right now there is still much to be done with decorating and buying and setting up of the new equipment in preparation for the all important Ofsted building inspection but the opening day will be the culmination of over a year's hard work by the voluntary committee. Chairperson Lindsey Savage first floated proposals with the parish council and primary school in March 2006. By June, exhaustively

prepared applications had been made to Suffolk County Council that in September secured a £139,000 building grant from central government's Extended Schools Scheme.

Awards of £1500 from Adnams Charity and £1800 from the Pepyn & Lessey Trust and £7000 by Suffolk Acre followed for the costs of professional fees and new equipment. The pre-school children got involved too by raising over £775 by holding sponsored bounces and cake sales.

MORE OPPORTUNITIES TO LEARN

Ever since Wenhaston Pre-School opened its doors in 2001, it has held sessions three mornings per week at the village hall but would have to close whenever another booking conflicted with the schedule. Now, in its own building, it can hold sessions five days a week and extend sessions to 1.00 pm. A holiday club and after school club will use the building as well, run by a separate committee, the Wenhaston Community Play Scheme.

During term time the Wenhaston After School Club will operate from 3.15 pm to 6.00 pm providing an extended - but more relaxed - learning environment for 5-9 year olds and in school holidays; Wenhaston Holiday Club will run from 8.00 am to 6.00 pm. An area is being fenced for outdoor play and gardening and with the playing fields adjacent, more learning will be done outdoors to promote physical fitness. Wenhaston can be proud that its pre-school has already attained the highest possible Ofsted rating and this effort has been the response to the challenges set by Ofsted and the community's recognition that it's never too early to start giving children the best possible chances in life.

Positions for Play Leaders to run the after school and holiday clubs are still open. There are possibilities for flexible working and job sharing in these roles and anyone interested is urged to contact Lindsey Savage on 01986 872947 or email nfsuffolk@aol.com for an application form immediately.

'Smasher' Dowsing rides again

WHEN Circle 67's play *The Iconoclast* comes to the Village Hall on 20 April, it won't be the first time that the infamous William 'Smasher' Dowsing's men have visited Wenhaston.

Commissioned by Parliament to empty the churches of 'superstitious images,' in 1643 he sent his men to St Peter's, where they broke all the stained glass windows, took away the font cover and the organ—and made the churchwardens pay their costs!

Luckily for Wenhaston our famous 'Doom' had already been lime-washed over to hide it from an earlier despoliation, and it stayed out of sight for another 250 years. But the Vicar was removed from office in 1644 for 'ungodly activity,' as were the vicars of Blyford and Holton.

Bernard Fox's play, written especially for Circle 67's 40th anniversary year (its 'Ruby Jubilee'), is based on the dramatic story of Dowsing's official visit to Laxfield, his own home parish, in the following year and of his clash with the Vicar and his own family there.
