

Halesworth Rainbow Savers

Since January this year there has been a credit union collection point in Halesworth Library every Friday between 11:00am and 1:00pm serving both Halesworth and the surrounding villages. Part of the Lowestoft based Rainbow Saver Anglia Credit Union Ltd we are fully regulated by the Financial Services Authority and deposits are protected by the Financial Services Compensation Scheme.

Credit Unions provide a money management system that is of particular interest to those who either do not have bank accounts or occasionally need moderate loans in exchange for showing the discipline of being able to save regularly. A key objective of credit unions is to help people avoid paying extortionate interest rates and penalty charges to doorstep or internet lenders. We rely on a number of people being prepared to deposit sums with us, for no interest, so that money can be made available for those who need it.

There is free life assurance paying 150% of deposits at time of death and a Junior Savers scheme which pays interest. Deposits can be made at the library on a Friday or wherever there is a PayPoint sign. There is a 'lock it away' scheme for Christmas or holidays and a Debit Card scheme. Wages and benefits, such as housing benefits, can be paid into a credit union account and landlords can be paid directly by the credit union.

No work parties will be taking place in April or May during the breeding season. Instead volunteers from the group will be assisting with recording, and we hope to publish results later in the year.

We are grateful to Suffolk Coastal District Council for funding the cost of materials to construct 8 rabbit exclosures, which Suffolk Wildlife Trust will be erecting for us on Blackheath, Bickers and Mill Heath.

Rabbits have been heavily grazing the heather seedlings now established in those areas that have been re-seeded in recent years. The exclosures will allow the heather inside to establish and grow sufficiently to be of no further interest to them, so that the exclosure can then be moved to another area and eventually removed altogether.

Speeding Drivers

I've done a fair bit in my 34 years on this planet, some of which I had forgotten until Monday, March 1st 2010 at around 4:15pm.

I would like to offer my thanks to the young male driver of a black car who drove up Heath Road heading towards Halesworth at a speed far exceeding the posted 30mph limit for the village, who helped me re-live a number of childhood memories of which I had long since forgotten.

As he passed by me, my life flashing before my eyes, my only other thought (apart from 'get the out of the way!') was for my 3 year old daughter who was in my arms and that if this driver had hit us, she wouldn't have stood a chance.

The poor little girl wouldn't have had much of a life to flash before her eyes before the impact - ripping her little heart away from her thoracic aorta, rupturing her delicate liver and spleen and causing other massive internal injuries. She may have even stayed conscious long enough whilst exsanguinating to wonder what was happening and what she had done that was so wrong to get punished like this. Hopefully she wouldn't have felt any pain.

I'm not an arrogant or ignorant man, I realise we ALL drive too fast from time to time but I would like to take this opportunity to remind those reading this that Heath Road is a single track road with a blind summit at the top of the hill which coincides with the national speed limit sign.

To compound this hazard, a number of young children live in the houses on the road and there are always cars parked on the verges due to a lack of adequate parking. This results in poor visibility of the road ahead and a number of hazards that need to be dealt with.

Any of these hazards could have a young (or not so young) person standing behind them waiting to walk out in front of you whilst on the way to the Co-Op for your fruit and veg thinking about whether to have chips or mash for tea.

Please, please, please watch your speed as you leave and enter the village along Heath Road.

Would you be able to live with yourself if you killed a child?

Would you speed past your own house down a single track road with hazards on it while your children were playing in the front garden? How would you feel if you hit and killed your own flesh and blood?

Or is it OK because it's just someone else's flesh and blood smeared across the road and the bonnet of your car?

Local History Matters: 25

The Burial Register

Although it was in the 1530s the Parish Registers had to be kept regarding Baptisms, Mariages and Burials, it is only from 1687 that records are in existence for Wenhaston. Looking at the burials there have been over the years comments concerning the burials and the causes of death are interesting:

1701 29 March. Thomas Smith, Schoolmaster. 1713 15 October. Robert Ashby died very suddendly in a field, there being nobody with him. He was not missing for two hours before he was found dead of Apoplexy.

1774 5 February. John and Elizabeth Buck killed when a gable end of a stable fell on them.

1777 28 June. Reverend John Leman 'died of the stones after five years of extreme pain. He was open by Doctor Durban of Halesworth and two very large stones were found'.

1777 7 August. Sarah Adams drowned. Over the years one finds a number of children drowning in the River Blyth.

1781 A 'putrid fever' broke out in Blythburgh and the House of Industry. A third of the village died and 130 in the House of Industry. There must have been cases in Wenhaston, but the Parish only show a modest increase. However there were eight burials in 1777, but from 1779 to 1785 the average was twenty two.

1793 17 January. James Bottom, a pauper, died of starvation.

1797 Eight infants die in May. A possible epidemic.

1802 2 August. William Tuthill, infant, died by a wagon accidentally going over him when asleep in a field where women and children were gleaning.

1854 11 March. Hannah Ellis aged 101. Unusual age for mid 19th century.

1914 Sadly 24 names with five missing on War Memorial

and five more added for 1939-1945.

We welcomed visitors from other WIs this month.

Acting as the indomitable Fanny Kemble, Louise Reed gave an amusing and informative account of Fanny's life. Born in France into a family of actors, she returned to the UK when eighteen. Against her wishes, family misfortunes decreed that she starred in her uncle's theatre in Covent Garden. To further her career she sailed to America with her Father. One gentleman, Mr Butler, watched her performance every night finally proposing marriage, Fanny accepted.

The family moved to Georgia when Mr. Butler inherited a plantation, complete with 900 slaves. Fanny was appalled by the system and did what she could to help the slaves. She bullied Mr Butler into building a hospital and she taught the slaves to read although it was against the law. This caused a rift between the couple and they eventually divorced.

Fanny returned to England where she wrote a book of her American experiences. She died at the age of 84 years.

Footpath Walking


The morning walk on Tuesday 6th April will leave from Wenhaston Village Hall at 10am.
