

Are You Thinking Of Getting A Dog?

Police are urging anyone considering buying a dog via the internet to be alert after reports of a scam designed to get money under false pretences.

A Rendlesham resident spotted an advert on the internet for a Siberian husky puppy, saying all that would be needed to buy the puppy was the cost of transport - several hundred pounds. The buyer was told there was a shipping company involved and was asked to pay half of the cost. She was then asked for more money as refundable insurance. In total £350 was sent off to an address in Africa.

The buyer was then told that the dog was stuck at a UK airport and that further cash would be needed for permits and again several hundred pounds was requested. The buyer then contacted the airport and was told there were no dogs awaiting shipment. At this point it was realised this was a scam and no further money was handed over.

Police have recently received several reports of residents throughout Suffolk being conned in a similar way with a variety of different dogs, usually puppies, being used to entice buyers. These dogs include breeds such as King Charles Spaniels, Pugs and English Bulldogs.

Police are urging anyone considering buying a dog via the internet to be cautious and not to send money if there are any doubts the seller may not be genuine. In many of these cases the buyers have transferred money to banks or addresses in Africa despite the seller often giving a story that they are UK based.

As with any transaction it is always wise to speak to local sellers/tradesmen to get quotes or view animals/items before agreeing to purchase, as many reputable companies/dealers will be covered by other guarantees and trade association good practice. **Police Direct Team**

WI Churchyard Detectives!

Since 2008, members of the Wenhaston WI, helped by families and friends, have been examining and recording the memorials in St Peter's Churchyard. We obtained permission from the PCC, advice from Suffolk Family History Society, and then set to work. You may have seen us, in all weathers, clambering round holly bushes looking intently at badly eroded headstones.

After deciphering them, a careful study of the Burial Register to check details and add extra information followed, which meant that we could work out all but two. We also produced a map, which proved to be very challenging, as they are not arranged neatly!

Books with the full inscriptions will soon be on view in the church, a CD or book can also be purchased locally, and Blythweb have kindly put all the information on their Wenhaston website. We have also sent it to the Suffolk Record Office and the Suffolk Family History Society.

We have just finished deciphering the churchyard extension, and it will hopefully be available in Spring 2011. It has been fun and rewarding. Good to know that a part of the village's history is now recorded for family historians both now and in the future.

Millennium Map

The 10th anniversary of the Wenhaston Millennium Map was celebrated on Saturday afternoon, 30th October, in the Village Hall. It was well attended and a very interesting occasion.

As one entered the Hall, to the right were tables set out for refreshments, to the left a large area of tables laid out to show how the map evolved.

Starting in 1997 the frontage of every building in Wenhaston was drawn (by a large band of volunteers). There were samples of these drawings, along with photos. Then came photos of all the hedges and roadside vegetation. Further on were aerial photos; next came details of research into the many village activities; then scale map drawings.

In the centre was the album made by Maurice Naunton with its detailed account of the whole 3-year project. Lastly there were the maps themselves.

In addition to all this were two smaller displays: one manned by Heather Phillips of other maps and historical documents, the second by Dilys Grimwade showing work done by the WI on gravestones in the churchyard and adjacent cemetery. **V Jackson**

Wenhaston with Mells Hamlet Parish Council (October)

The Parish Council has been informed that it is unlikely that the path at Star Hill will be constructed due to Government cut backs in the foreseeable future. The Parish Council are going to see whether it is possible for a street light to be erected on Star Hill.

The cost of insuring the BMX track on the playing field is \pounds 3,000.00 and the track would have to be enclosed due to the fact that the field is a public area.

The sports club are looking at the possibility of changing the skate board area to a BMX track this will cost about $\pounds10,000.00$.

District Councillor Austin stated that as soon as information regarding the Government's cut backs are known and how it will affect the District Council he will report back to the Parish Council.

Cllr. Orme, the Chairman of the Village Hall Committee, stated that he was still trying to get the selling of the electricity from the solar panels sorted out.

Various events are being put on in the Village Hall and he hopes that as many people as possible attend and support the hall.

The roots of the hedge around the hall car park are going to be dug out and posts and wire are going to be erected. It has been reported that children on bikes are riding between the roots of the hedges straight out on to the road nearly causing accidents, hence the hedge roots being removed.

A meeting has taken place with all interested parties about the flood risk to the A12 at Blythburgh. One suggestion is that a barrier and sluice be erected, another raising the A12 by 2 metres. Parishioners will be kept informed as and when any more information is available. Mary Pennock, Clerk

The Precept for 2011/2012 has been set for £13,250.00, an increase of £250.00. The Parish Council has been very prudent in setting the Precept. The cost of a Parish Council election next year is to come out of reserves. The amount being about £700.00.

Cllr. Edwards reported that the Village Plan Consultation and Talent Show was a great success. About 70 parishioners took part in the survey indicating as to what they would like to see in Wenhaston in the future. Also, the talent show was very impressive.

As Star Hill footpath is now a non starter, the Parish Council are trying to see whether two lights could be put up on Star Hill Lane. The cost of the lights would have to come out of reserves.

The Parish Council would prefer a sluice gate and barrier put up on the coast side of the A12, instead of raising the A12. The Chairman to write to our MP, asking her to clarify her decision regarding the A12 and perhaps attend a Parish Council meeting.

Often Parishioners complain that they don't know what is going on regarding the Parish Council. Minutes and Agenda are put up at the Village Hall and Well Green, as well as on the Wenhaston website. All the meetings are open to the public so come along and hear for yourselves.
