# Wenhaston with Mells Hamlet Parish Council

Would the people who are putting their 'doggy bags' in the bins in the Cemetery, and the Playingfield, please refrain from doing so. SCDC will not empty these bins. Instead please take your bags to the designated bins.

The precept for the year 2010/2011 has been set for £13,000.00 an increase of £500.00.

A committee has been formed to review the Village Plan. A comprehensive appraisal was conducted in 2000, and the Village Plan was reviewed in 2006. Some of the issues from the original plan have been dealt with. Please give your views about issues you are concerned about to the Parish Council.

County Cllr. Leighton informed the Council the cost of filling in the pot holes due to the bad weather will cost SCC about £3 million. Highways will be starting this work soon. Please be patient if you have reported pot holes

The Parish Council will be ordering two more grit/salt bins, one to go by the Telephone Box and the other at the bottom of Coles Hill.

This covers everything listed in Bands 1 and 2 above. plus crowns, dentures or bridges.
