Scott's Forgotten Surgeon

Polar explorer, Dr Reginald Koettlitz, who clashed with Captain Scott on the first expedition to Antarctica, is the subject of a new biography by Gus Jones.

The book, entitled 'Scott's Forgotten Surgeon', reveals that tensions between the two men led to Scott ignoring expert advice on food, prevention of scurvy, transportation and other vital polar skills crucial to survival in such extreme regions.

Mistakes made on the first expedition between 1901 and 1904 were repeated on the tragic 1912 expedition, when Scott and his four companions, suffering from scurvy, succumbed to freezing temperatures.

So why did Gus choose to write about this particular doctor, who, until now, has been largely written out of polar history?

Thirty-five years ago Gus met Ann Koettlitz, the great niece of Dr Koettlitz. They married in 1980 and now live in Wenhaston. Over the years the extraordinary exploits of Dr Koettlitz began to emerge.

The serious research began when Gus approached retirement and turned into an

eight-year writing challenge with trips to South Africa, where Koettlitz died, Scotland, where he trained, the Wellcome Trust Museum in London, to Dover, the Scott Polar Research Institute in Cambridge and copious correspondence worldwide.

The book was launched, together with a presentation of artefacts by Ann, at the Dundee Heritage Museum, the home of RRS Discovery, and at The Halesworth Bookshop last month.

The book is a tribute to the remarkable courage, scientific knowledge and extraordinary survival skills of Scott's forgotten surgeon, Dr Reginald Koettlitz. *Ann Jones*

Local History Matters: 35

Farming

In the Doomsday Book of 1086 Wenhaston had woodland for 110 swine and arable land for 10 ploughs. There were 30 pigs and 16 sheep in Mells. Sibton Abbey later owned Wenhaston Grange and used it as a sheep farm. Hemp and flax were grown, as in the Tithe Map of 1839 there appears two fields named Hemplands, six called Clay Pits and three Maltster Fields with one Kiln Ground, which would seem to indicate the owners' occupations.

There were two windmills and one watermill in the parish dealing with corn products. In the Tithe Map of 1839 there were 260 arable fields and 130 pastures. Wheat and barley were grown and sugar beet first made its appearance at Laurel Farm in 1936.

In the 1841 Census Wenhaston showed 13 farmers and 114 farm workers but with the advent of machinery by 1861 farm workers numbered 53. Wenhaston Young Farmers Club was formed in 1938. *Keith Johnceline*

Wenhaston Energy Support Group

Some fascinating results emerged following the thermal camera project, launched recently by the Wenhaston Energy Support Group.

The East Bergholt Society kindly loaned the group their thermal camera for two weeks. WESG's team of three, Roger Claxton, Robin Dillaway and Geoff Robinson worked very hard and managed to survey and prepare reports on 21 buildings including the Village Hall, the Methodist Chapel and The Star.

As a result of their findings it was quite easy to come up with some simple inexpensive suggestions.

• Close all curtains and blinds as soon as it gets dark, even in rooms you do not use

• Make sure they are closed as far down as possible on to the sill , especially ruched blinds

• Use draught excluders at the bottom of doors, or buy compressible door seals if you think there is a draught

• Insulate the loft hatch

The Village Hall's energy saving measures are working well, although it definitely makes a difference if curtains and blinds are closed. Any groups using the hall in the evening should shut the curtains to keep the heat in.

One householder said after the survey: "I'm upgrading my sewing machine to festoon the house with warmer curtains - much cheaper than replacing windows!"

This project may be repeated next year, if there is enough demand, so sign up with WESG if you would like to be involved.

The photo-voltaic initiative resulted in five households installing an array of panels on their rooves and more are expected to follow.

Call 101 ~ A New Way To Contact Your Police

Suffolk Constabulary has introduced a new telephone number, 101, for people who want to talk to the police about non-urgent issues. It is designed to offer an easy way to report non-emergency crimes, disorder or anti-social behaviour, or to speak to your local police officers.

For example ring 101 if:

- a vehicle has been stolen
- property has been damaged
- there is suspect drug use or dealing
- you wish to give the police information about crime in the area
- you wish to speak to a local police officer.

Available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week with calls from landlines and mobile networks costing 15p per call, no matter what time of day or the duration of the call. Those who are deaf, hard of hearing or speech impaired can textphone 18001 101.

This is part of a nationwide initiative. It is also hoped that the introduction of 101 will help divert more non-urgent calls away from the 999 system, freeing up call handlers to deal with genuine emergencies. In an emergency, always ring 999 for immediate police assistance. **Police Direct Team**

Driving Another Person's Vehicle

Suffolk Police warn motorists who are driving a vehicle not belonging to them using their own fully comprehensive insurance, that they may no longer be covered to do so.

Despite the assumption by many that a fully comprehensive insurance policy would cover drivers to use another person's vehicle with their permission, there has recently been a change in many insurance policies and this cover often no longer comes as standard. This information will appear either on the front of your certificate or in the small print, so it is the driver's responsibility to make sure they are covered.

One issue that officers specifically want motorists to check is in relation to driving another person's vehicle with the owner's permission when the vehicle does not have an insurance policy in place. With recent changes the majority of insurers now stipulate that the vehicle being driven must at least have third party cover.

If a person is stopped in a vehicle that is not their own and are unsure if their policy covers them to drive another vehicle, officers will have to complete a check. If it is discovered that the driver is not correctly covered it could result in a fixed penalty notice fine of £200 and 6 penalty points, or a day at Magistrates Court. The vehicle will also be seized.

There is a lack of awareness of this policy change so this is a polite reminder to all motorists to have a double-check. However, we are also aware that there will be people out there who are deliberately offending and therefore appropriate action will be used wherever necessary.
