Thorington Church Art Exhibition

Early summer sees the fourth annual Thorington Church Art Exhibition at St Peter's Church, Thorington on June 23rd and 24th.

Admission to the church and exhibition is free and visitors are invited to enjoy the spectacular array of art by many local artists. As ever this popular event will include plenty of things to see and do including activities for children, local field trials, lunches and strawberry cream teas in the Old Rectory garden. Other stalls on offer include local crafts and iewellery plus local seasonal produce. Visitors can also take part in a guided walk around the nearby Suffolk Wildlife Trust property. A silent auction and raffle will be held each day featuring a wide range of money-can't-buy prizes.

St Peter's Church is a beautiful example of a traditional round tower structure with a Norman arch discovered just twenty years ago. With only 48 parishioners in Thorington and an annual cost of £5,000 to maintain the building this small community is dependent on innovative fund-raising to keep the much-loved Church open.

This year's special feature is a poetry reading by Cicely Herbert - co-founder of the internationally successful Poems on the Underground – with a poetry competition for local schoolchildren

Wenhaston W.I.

In the unavoidable absence of the President our May meeting was ably chaired by Helen Bowyer. As is traditional in May, the business part of the meeting was concerned with a discussion of this year's WI Public Affairs Resolution or campaign to be backed by Members. In previous years a number of topics have been put forward for debate but this year the focus of the Institute's attention is "to stop the closure of Community Hospitals which provide services to local people". Marro Johnstone proposed the topic, drawing attention to the fact that the smaller Community Hospitals were cleaner and therefore patients were less prone to infection and the quality of care, particularly in regard to the nutritional needs of patients, was invariably of a higher standard than that offered in larger hospitals. The motion was agreed unanimously and will go forward for further discussion at the Annual General Meeting which is being held in the Albert Hall in June, to which Wenhaston are sending five delegates. Members were thanked for their donations to and participation in the Spring Fayre event which was held last month and, it was agreed by the meeting that, from the proceeds, a donation of £300 will be made to the team working in our area on behalf of the NSPCC

After a break for tea the meeting was pleased to welcome our speaker for the evening, Bryn Raven, who enlightened us on the activity of Eco Teams. These are based on a concept which originated in Holland and are formed to pool and share information regarding a concern for the environment. There are about 200 such teams in England and Bryn is a member of a group which has been active recently in Wenhaston. Bryn had some very frightening statistics to give, for example:-1.5 million computers are dumped in land fill sites every year 90% of which are fully functioning.

The UK produces enough rubbish every hour to fill the Albert Hall.

The Eco Team encourages its members to measure the waste their home produces and

devise strategies to reduce this, disposing of what is unavoidable in the most environmentally friendly way possible.

Bryn encouraged anyone who had not yet done so to return the recently distributed questionnaire relating to Carbon Footprints as the village may receive some financial advantage from SCDC to improve recycling facilities. Cathy Harrison

Local History Matters: 2

The Romans

Experts agree that Wenhaston was an important settlement and trading post. Ships sailed up the River Blyth to Blyford (Blythford), but could not proceed further, so they emptied their cargo here. The market was between Star Hill and the River. The fields have been walked and much Samian pottery, brooches and over 500 coins have been found. One presumes that the inhabitants lived on the higher ground, and possibly a small Roman Temple was built - are its foundations to be found under our present church? Communication was important and there is a Roman Road from Bungay to Halesworth, and it probably wound its way from Holton to

Blyford by the river and forded over to Wenhaston. When ploughing a field by Blyford Bridge in the 1880s, a farmer discovered a Roman statuette of Venus, six inches high. There is a small stream that leaves the River Blyth and goes under the road at Brook Farm.



This threads it's way through Thorington marshes to Bramfield. It was much wider and deeper in olden times, as in the Bramfield records there is an entry 'Taking the hay down to the wharf at Bramfield'. *Keith Johnceline*

Wenhaston Mothers' Union

We welcomed Anne Holland to our May Meeting to tell us about the trip to Antarctica she and her husband took in February/March 2006. Anne said that despite some reservations about the cold and rough terrain, they decided that they would take the trip. The expedition started at Ushuaia in Argentina, and on the way to the edge of Antarctica, the cruise ship, Explorer, with 200 passengers, visited The Falkland Islands, South Georgia and the South Orkneys. The interesting thing about these islands was mostly the wildlife, although there were some small churches (one **4**

a cathedral), and they were able to see Ernest Shackleton's grave on Elephant Island, and the area where his ship was trapped in the ice for many months, as well as the place where he and his crew eventually came ashore. The passengers saw many thousands of King Penguins and their young, who seemed unperturbed by the human presence, Fur seals – some of which were quite vicious, elephant seals, which slept on regardless, reindeer, chinstrap penguins to name but a few.

All of the passengers were supplied with warm red parkas, and when they reached Antarctica, the ice was a delicate blue, and very beautiful. A visit was made to Deception Island which was a huge volcano, and across the channel there was an opportunity to swim in hot springs, although Anne herself declined. It was not quite possible to reach the Arctic Circle as they were only able to explore the very edge of the continent, which is huge, being the fifth largest in the world, but we could tell by Anne's enthusiasm that it had been wonderful, an experience of a lifetime. Anne was thanked by Valerie Ellis.

In June we are visiting Helmingham Hall on 13th in place of our meeting. Cars leave the Village Hall Car Park at 1:30pm. Teas are available at the Hall, and anyone wishing to go should contact June Lewis on 01502 478106.
