Preserving Our Community

I came away from the recent Parish Council Meeting with a strong concern that Wenhaston is in danger of allowing a planning application to seriously undermine the very thing which makes it a special village: its strong sense of community. We live in a village where the need to make a living from the land has always existed alongside areas of rare and sometimes fragile natural beauty. Like other rural communities, Wenhaston has had to adapt to changes in its way of life: changes in farming practice, an influx of people from other areas, new housing developments and the closure of shops and pub.

Despite these changes, we have a thriving school, lively sports and youth clubs, many other clubs and organisations, small businesses and a pub which continues to offer a warm welcome to all. I hope that as we discuss this latest change to village life, we can think about the issue in a balanced and sensitive way rather than allowing it to become a divisive and bitter dispute. The very real concerns of those living close to the proposed development, the impact on everybody's life of increased traffic and visitors, the benefits of new job opportunities, the impact on the natural environment are important issues which need careful consideration. As decisions are reached, what is of paramount importance is that we preserve and develop the life of our village community for future generations.

Cllr Bernard Orme was re-elected as Chairman and Cllr. Trevor Tate was re-elected as Vice Chairman of the Parish Council

Mr John Goodyear of SCC and Mr John Davies of SCDC met with the Parish Council to discuss Star Hill Footpath. Hopefully the Parish Council are one step nearer to the footpath being constructed.

Hastoe Housing will be starting the affordable housing any time now.

The Parish Council would like to clarify the plans meeting on 29th April to discuss CO8/2216 - New Farm, Blackheath Road. Erection of 20 holiday log cabins, shop and toilet/facilities block, and provision on site for 20 visiting caravans. The Chairman allowed the meeting to be closed in order that parishioners might have their say. The meeting was formally re-opened for the Councillors who were present to express their views.

The Chairman Cllr. Orme proposed and Cllr. Ives seconded that the planning application be supported by the Parish Council. The five Councillors present voted three in favour and two against. Proxy votes from the Councillors unable to attend the meeting were counted, three against and two in favour. Ten Parish Councillors voted. This amounted to a spilt vote of the Parish Council.

The Chairman, under the Meeting and Procedure of a Local Council, Local Council Administration Act, could have cast a second or casting vote but declined.

As the Parish Council were spilt the Chairman proposed that SCDC be informed of the spilt vote. Also that some of the Councillors had expressed that they might view the application in a different light if a new planning application was received reducing the size of the development. Proposed by Cllr. Orme and seconded by Cllr. Dickson.

The Chairman during the open meeting did in fact disassociate himself and the Parish Council from the comments that were expressed about 'Incomers' Mary Pennock, Clerk

Wenhaston WI

Ok so I lied. Jenny Gibbs' talk wasn't about Turkish Cuisine but about Turkish Ladies in the last 90 years and fascinating it was too. Jenny walked into the room in full traditional Turkish dress, colourful and, she assured us, comfortable. She has lived in Turkey for 16 years in a village that has hardly changed for centuries.

Any ideas we had about Turkish women being subservient to their men were swiftly banished, Turkey being a Matriarchal society. Even in the time of the Ottoman Empire it was the Sultan's Mother who made political decisions. When the Empire fell in 1923, women were given equal rights with men, in education, the work place and in schools. They were also given the vote. Turkey had the first woman Prime Minister, Supreme Court judge and combat pilot. Although marriages are still arranged, there are many rituals to go through and the girl has the final say. The two families meet and she makes coffee for them. If she likes the chosen man she makes the coffee sweet if not she puts salt into the coffee. No word is spoken so no 'face' is lost either side.

Jenny ended her talk by sharing some Turkish dishes with us. The evening had been a Turkish Delight.

Local History Matters: 19

Bells

There have been bells in the tower of St Peter's for many hundreds of years. In 1553 there were four bells and a Sanctus bell, however the dates on our bells show them to have been cast before then.

Nowadays there are six bells, one is dated 1386 and another 1450. Of the other four bells, one is dated 1767, two are dated 1787 and the remaining one 1823.

By an Inventory of 1636 there were six bells 'well fixed and in good repair'. It is thought that the two oldest bells may have come from Blythburgh Priory after the Dissolution of 1535.

In the Churchwarden Accounts there are frequent references to payment for food and drink for Bellringers for special occasions such as Coronations, November 5th, weddings etc. One notes that in 1693 two shillings was paid for mending the treble bell which young Buxton had broken purposely!
