Helping Older People Stay Independent In Suffolk

A local charity has announced that it can offer more help to older people in Suffolk who want to remain living independently in their own homes

Age UK Suffolk has recently re-launched its successful Independence Advisors Service as a result of a new partnership with Supporting People Suffolk.

"The Independence Advisors Service offers a home visit from a friendly, well informed advisor" said Independence Advisors' Manager, Marsha Janssens.

"We can visit anyone over 60 wherever they live in Suffolk and the visit is free. Our Advisors are able to discuss any issue that is affecting someone's daily life and give accurate information and advice about services available to help people stay independent."

"The Independence Advisors Service has been running successfully for 5 years in partnership with Suffolk County Council, but a recent injection of funding from Supporting People Suffolk will allow us to expand the service, employing more advisors to meet the high demand for visits" said Mrs Janssens.

"As part of this new funding we will be seeking in particular to offer our service to older people living in the county's Sheltered Housing schemes, in order to assist residents to be fully informed about services available to help them stay living independently for longer."

Helen was found to have tumours in both eyes at a very young age and therefore lost her sight. When her mother asked the doctor how to bring up a blind baby, she was told to bring her up like any other baby, and this is what she did. Nothing seems to have stopped her - she had a very good education at a School for the Blind, read English at University, taught English in Bangkok, and then at various institutions in the UK. However it was her Christian Faith that shone through all of this, and Helen attended Theological College and became a Lay Reader in the Church of England, then a Curate at Brighton where she met her future husband, Michael Patten. Her final post before retirement was Chaplain in a Hospice in Hastings where her mission was to bring the dying to God in a gentle way. She says that life is full of challenges, and hers must have been but she has met them full on and is a great inspiration to us all.

Local History Matters: 32

Taxes

No one likes paying taxes but it is no new thing. Here are a few examples of taxes in times past:

1327 - Subsidy Returns. 1/20th of value of movable goods and must have at least 5/-worth to be taxed. 25 were taxed amounting to £1.14.1. Heading the list were Galfrido de Wenhaston and Thoma Gorge 2/6 each.

1381 - Poll Tax. All persons over 15 years old, one shilling per person.
In Blything Hundred 221 paid £21.1.0.

1524 - Subsidy Returns. 1/20th of movable goods. Total amount £4.15.8. William Pepyn £1.10.0. 29 in Wenhaston and 12 in Mells.

1568 - Subsidy Roll. 16 pence per pound of value of land and 10 pence per pound on value of goods. Total amount £2.18.8.
15 in Wenhaston and 5 in Mells.

1640 - Ship Money. 'For the safeguarding of the seas and defence of the realm.' £14.6.0 for 57 people.

1674 - Hearth Tax. 2 shillings per hearth. £187 for 64 inhabitants. John Hall and John Leman each had 10 hearths. *Keith Johnceline*

Does Someone You Love Drink Too Much?

For a significantly large and growing number of men, women and teenagers, alcohol takes over their lives to the point where relationships, friendships, jobs, morals and values, all take second place to their dependency on alcohol. When a relative or close friend drinks too much it is impossible to remain unaffected by the negative effects of their drinking.

The drinkers can successfully hide their dependency; the family and friends hide their concerns and suspicions, preferring to keep their heads buried in the sand, until a crisis forces change. Behind closed doors his or her family may have suffered physical and mental abuse, shame, fear and financial insecurity for years. If this has happened to you then you could get help by going to a local Al-Anon Group. Al-Anon is a world-wide fellowship of relatives and friends of alcoholics who believe that alcoholism is a family illness and that changed attitudes can aid recovery. At these meetings members get comfort and understanding from others who have been affected. Over a period of time they learn how to cope with their individual problems and come to accept alcoholism as an illness.

There is an Al-Anon Group at the Harmony Centre, Walpole Hatch Farm, Halesworth, Suffolk, IP19 9BB. The meeting is every Wednesday at 7pm. New members are always made welcome.
