An extract from a report about Wenhaston Village Hall, received from the Chairman of the Management Committee, is as follows:

The boiler has been put on again and is functioning well. The Autumn/Winter seasons will give us the opportunity to fine tune settings, making the system as efficient as possible. We will also be able to assess costs from statistical information

The Photo Voltaic system is running well. We are waiting for a re-quotation from Good Energy for buying back electricity. The Energy Saving Trust website allows comparisons with other providers so we will shortly be in a position to sell back our generated electricity.

The final grants have now been claimed but considerable efforts are going into future fundraising.

Phase II Refurbishment. At the last Management meeting, it was decided that Phase II should be put on hold and the situation reviewed in November.

Wenhaston Energy Support Group

Warmer Wenhaston is back, November 2009.

This is a DIY project aimed at helping people who want to put in their own insulation - either themselves or with local labour - whether loft insulation, solid wall insulation, draught proofing or pipe lagging. Every household with a combined income of £40,000 or below can apply. Households with incomes over £40,000 who wish to be involved can benefit from the bulk buy. Just send a completed form to SCDC. There is a form included with this copy of Wenhaston Word, and forms will also be available at the Post Office. Goods will be allocated to households according to household income, the potential for carbon/energy savings and availability of funds. The completed form should be sent to Suffolk Coastal District Council (SCDC) who will process it. All information is completely confidential. The closing date for the form to be received by SCDC is 1st December 2009.

Once the form is processed, the insulation and other materials will be bulk purchased and made available for successful applicants to collect from the Village Hall at a date to be notified. All who fill in the form and submit it by the deadline will be included in the project, subject to demand. 
