River Blyth Footpath - Wenhaston/Blythburgh

Walkers have known for a couple of years that the footpath on the South bank of the River Blyth had been deteriorating. It is now impossible to use. Not to worry; the path on the North bank was still useable. Or so we thought. Earlier this year Simon Barnes, writing in the Times, drew attention to the fact that "Footpath Closed" notices had been posted at either end of the footpath.

A villager, alarmed at the prospect of losing the riverside walk to Blythburgh, arranged to meet representatives of Suffolk County Council and the Environment Agency. I was invited to join them.

We walked the closed section from the A12 as far as a padlocked gate and then back again. The path is not being maintained so the grass is long. However, enough walkers have used the path to make it easily seen. The path narrows at one place where the bank is clearly undercut. However, we all walked the section without mishap.

We discussed the situation and established that SCC have no power to close a footpath or padlock gates. The padlock is to be removed and the notices replaced altered to "No Through Route". This isn't strictly true; there is a through route but a short section of it is deemed unsafe. The clear purpose of the notices is to discourage the walking of the path through to Blythburgh.

I believe that the new notices are an over-reaction and a slide into "nannying" mode.

A simple declaration that a short section of the bank near the A12 is judged unsafe by the Environment Agency and people who walk through to Blythburgh proceed entirely at their own risk should be sufficient. If you are concerned about the loss of this lovely riverside walk please contact John Dawson, Rights of Way Officer, on 01728 403059 and tell him how you feel.

John Michael Hill Dickson

Mike Dickson was born in 1927 in Huddersfield. His parents were both medical practitioners and originated from Northern Ireland. He was their second child there being an older sister.

Mike was educated at Marlborough College and then read medicine at Cambridge and St Mary's London where he played rugby for the hospital. After qualifying he did his National Service in the Navy. In 1951 he married Jennifer (née Otter) and in 1956 he became a partner in the Halesworth practice with Drs Cursham and Besley. In 1957 he and Jennifer moved to Highfields in Halesworth where they raised their children Kate, Matthew, Ellie and Barney.

General Practice was about to change with purpose-built surgeries, group practices, attached nursing and other staff being encouraged by the Government. Mike embraced these changes with relish and became a founder member of the Royal College of General Practitioners.

He became senior partner in 1968 and steered the practice through many changes until his retirement in 1987. He and Jennifer then moved to Wenhaston, a village they loved, firstly to Hall Farm and later to Chapel Lane.

Mike was a devoted husband to Jennifer and a great father to his children. He was easily recognisable being very tall with a terrific booming laugh. He was endowed with a great social conscience and sense of humour. It was this amongst other things, which helped him to become a wonderful family doctor caring for his patients with warmth and diligence. He was also very interested in politics, local and national and was a life long Liberal. Somehow he found time to serve or lead on many councils, county, town, parish and community and on many committees concerned with the social fabric of our community.

His final illness, motor neurone disease, he faced with his usual equanimity and humour and he died on the 9th of September, at home peacefully.

Many people attended his funeral at St Peter's Wenhaston, a testament to how much he was respected and loved for all he did to enrich the lives of those around him and he will be missed by us all greatly. Cedric Clarke

Mrs E M Last

A Service of Thanksgiving for Mrs Emma (Barry) Last who died on 25 August aged 93 was held at St Andrew's Church Walberswick on 14 September conducted by the Vicar of Walberswick the Revd Brian Fisher. The Service was opened by a contingent of the Walberswick Choir led by Mrs Julia Josephs with a rendering of Mozart's Ave Verum. The hymns "Lead us Heavenly Father", "What a Friend we have in Jesus" and "Morning has broken" were sung.

Tributes were given by Nick and Adrian Weston (grandsons) who recalled some amusing family incidents and memories of their grandparents. They stressed how their upbringing had benefited from them during their formative years and how much they had been influenced by their grandmother. Ashka Pandya's "Ship of Friendship" was read by John Weston (son-in-law).

An Appreciation was given by Mr Derek Newby who had been a friend of her and her late husband for over 60 years. He said that Mr and Mrs Last accepted the posts of Master and Matron in 1947 of Bulcamp workhouse as it was known and which in Mrs Last's own words had been badly neglected and was a condemned slum. When they took over they were shown plans for a new building on the site, but this never materialised and they set about improving the conditions before the National Health Act of 1946. This meant that in time government money would be available to improve the building and living and nursing conditions there. By December in 1949 so much had been achieved through the efforts of Mr and Mrs Last that an article in the Eastern Daily Press reported and congratulated them on their efforts, From then on improvements continued and it became Blythburgh and District Hospital under the Ipswich Management Group Committee and by 1964 there was a combined total of 220 patients and other inmates living there as it had become a home for the elderly as well. Mrs Last and her staff won high praise from the late Dr John Agate one of the leading pioneers in the country on the rehabilitation of geriatrics after hospital care, and members of her staff were seconded to Ipswich Hospital to assist and advise when Amulree ward for geriatrics was opened there in 1967. Mrs Last was presented with the Queen's Silver Jubilee medal at Buckingham Palace in 1977 and before retiring she became responsible for the nursing staff at Halesworth and Southwold hospitals in addition to Blythburgh. She retired with her husband to Walberswick in 1977 but was widowed 26 years ago. The Rev Fisher read Psalm 121 and gave prayers and the Commendation and the Service was concluded with Nune Dimittus sung by the choir. She leaves a daughter and son-in-law, 3 grandchildren and 5 great grandchildren.

The family mourners were Mr and Mrs J Weston (daughter), Mr and Mrs Adrian Weston and Mr and Mrs Nicholas Weston (grandsons), Master Luca Weston (great grand-son), the Misses Sofia and Poppy Weston (great grand-daughters). Mrs Joanna Whitehead (grand-daughter) and family were unable to attend.

The Chairman asked for a one minute silence in memory of Michael Dickson.

District Cllr. Peter Austin reported that SCDC needs to save 30% over the next 3 years. A meeting has taken place in Wenhaston Village Hall between SCDC and Waveney District Council to try and amalgamate senior officers and some services to save money.

The Parish Council has been asked by SCDC to look at the Village Physical Limits Boundaries. It was decided to leave things as they are. The Parish Council will look at every planning application, whether the application is in the Village boundary or not, and make the appropriate decision.

The Chairman has had a meeting with SCC and the Environment Dept, about the closure of the north side of the river bank. The footpath was walked, the outcome being that the padlocks on the gates are to be removed. The posters stating that the river bank is closed are to be replaced with new ones advising that the footpath is unsafe.

Planning permission has been granted for the extension of Wenhaston Primary School.






Wenhaston Village Hall News
